General Information

VBS is an abbreviation for Vacation Bible School. At Eastridge Church, we believe in the spiritual well-being of all kids. We've added Activity Camp and Outdoor Camp to complete our 3 camps-in-1 model, which we now call Eastridge Kids' VBS Day Camp. Below are details and facts to help you make informed decisions. - Monday, July 10, 2023, to Thursday, July 13, 2023
- Preschool Half-day \$95 per camper Monday to Thursday, 9:00 am to 12:00 pm
- Elementary Full-day \$190 per camper Monday to Thursday, 9:00 am to 3:30 pm

- Thursday, July 13, 4-6pm – We celebrate the end of camp with performances, a free BBQ dinner, and tons of outdoor fun with inflatable games, including water slides, face painting, balloon sculpting, and so much more! Invite your whole family to join us. RSVPs will open on the first day of camp.

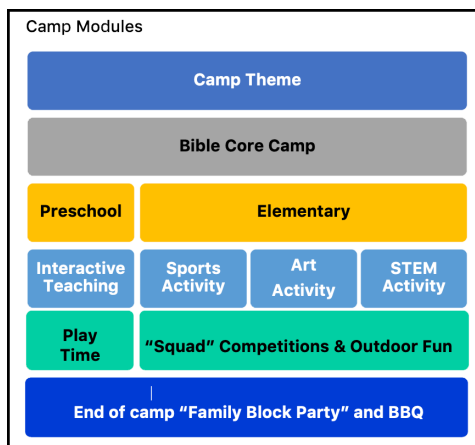
Finances

- \$25 deposit per child to reserve your spot. Balance due by July 03, 2023, to receive your digital access pass, which is required to check-in/check-out your child(ren) every day. You'll receive email notifications before the due date. At Eastridge Church, we believe everyone should be able to participate in our events. If the cost is prohibitive, we have a volunteer/scholarship plan available. Please get in touch with us by emailing kids@eastridgetoday.com. Preschool Information

Age

- 3 years of age to kindergarten
- To ensure children are developmentally ready to engage in all activities and maintain hygiene standards, **preschoolers must have turned 3 years of age by June 1, 2023, and must be potty trained.** Proof of birthdate may be required.



- A kindergartener that turns 6 years of age by June 1, 2023, can register for Elementary Day Camp as a first grader.
- There is one teacher and one helper per small group of 15 children.

Drop-off & Pick-up

- Daily drop-off is at 8:30am, and pick-up is at 12:00pm.

Programming

- Bible story and interactive lesson time, memory verses, and the Big Idea of the day are all reinforced through small group reflection times.
- Each day your child will experience activity rotation stations that include crafts, a sensory tent, art projects, music sing-along, and games relevant to the theme of the day.

- There will be structured play sessions in our secured playground and our indoor treehouse called Adventureland.

Snacks

- Snacks will be provided each day. This is a nut-free environment; however, if your child has food allergies, we encourage you to send an alternative snack with your child and inform their small group teacher. You will receive a camp-specific preparation guide before our camp start date. You'll see our snack schedule within this document.
- Lunch is not provided.

Elementary Information

Age

- 1st to 5th Grade
- There is one adult leader and one helper per group of 12 kids.

Drop-off & Pick-up

- Daily drop-off is at 8:30am, and pick-up is at 3:30pm.

Programming

- Our unique camp is really three camps incorporated into one – Bible Camp, Activity Camp, and Outdoor Camp. We’ve taken elements from each core camp to create a four-day incredible experience for kids without staying overnight!

Bible Camp

Our foundation is the Bible lesson of the day, live stage productions, worship time, and small group sessions where kids take time with their leader to dive a little deeper into the lesson, forge friendships, and journal during their time of reflection.

Activity Camp

*Each child registers for an Activity Track which will be their focus over four days. **The Activity Tracks are Sports, Art, or STEM.** Once the Activity Track is chosen, your child can choose one Monday+Tuesday activity **AND** one Wednesday+Thursday activity. The Activities are categorized into age-appropriate groupings – 1st to 3rd Grade, and 4th to 5th Grade. **Please note that an Activity Track or Activities cannot be changed mid-week!***

*Each day your son or daughter will receive Activity Track specific 45-minute morning and 45-minute afternoon lessons, for a total of 8 fun, explorative, and skill-building lessons with a teacher, coach, instructor, or professional who specializes in that activity. **The Activity Track and Activity Options menu is to the right.***

Outdoor Camp

All groups are added to one of four color Squads for fun-in-the-sun activities that only happen at camp, complete with team competitions, Small Group tournaments, and Minute-to-win-it games. In addition, they'll participate in our Humanitarian Project partnering with the Issaquah Food Bank donating cans of tuna and/or packets of Ramen. Each Squad will earn points throughout the week - Who will get to etch their team's name on the coveted camp trophy?!

Snacks

- You provide your camper's lunch.
- Snacks will be provided each day. This is a nut-free environment; however, if your child has food allergies, we encourage you to send an alternative snack with your child and inform their Squad leader. You will receive a camp-specific preparation guide before our camp start date. You'll see our snack schedule within this document.

- Go to our website and click register. When you arrive at the registration page, follow the prompts and register each child attending Elementary Camp by selecting Elementary.
- Step 1** - Choose age group – Lower Elementary (1st to 3rd Grade) or Upper Elementary (4th to 5th Grade)
Step 2 - Choose an Activity Track for the week: Sports, Art, or STEM
Step 3 - Choose either Option 1, 2, 3, or 4 within the already chosen Activity Track from Step 2. – **The Activity Track and Activity Options menu is to the right.**
